## Intended Outcome

- Enhanced leadership, policy and decision making capacities of GMS policy makers and top level officials in regional integration and strategic leadership

## Intended Outputs

## Strategic Leadership Program Competency Framework

- **Making a personal impact:** leading by example (personal leadership stories, cases from other leaders and the Shanghai experience)
- **Thinking strategically:** Harnessing policy ideas and opportunities to use/apply regional cooperation and integration for global competitiveness

## Strategic Leadership Program Competency Framework

- **Getting the best from others, learning and improving:** Sharing, drawing on experience and new ideas from others
- **Focusing on delivery:** Achieving greater integration by creating better policy outcomes and learning lessons from other regional groupings
- **Nurturing a sense of community:** Develop a network of GMS leaders who will act as regional champions . All participants will form part of the PPP alumni network

## Program Methodology

- daily study time and learning team discussions
- combination of learning methods -- lectures, group discussions, case studies and problem exercises
- participants organized by learning teams
- Practitioner orientation
- Action learning
